In order to secure its future and to be financially sustainable, the tourism industry in Moray is in the process of organising a vote amongst its members to create a new tourism body, funded by a levy on all tourism related businesses in Moray.

This was the theme of the annual tourism conference held in Elgin Town Hall on 8 November when the Chair of Visit Scotland gave the key note address.

Tourism is an increasingly important part of the Moray economy and it is vital it has a viable future if tourism is to grow and expand to its full potential.

As the Council commences the next round of budget deliberations it is important to monitor day-to-day expenditure.

I was therefore pleased to see that by keeping a keen eye on how we procure goods and services, annual savings of £1.7m have been achieved.

The Council plays a key role in supporting local business and industry by providing premises for rent located all across Moray. Target occupancy levels and rental income have exceeded targets which allows the Council to continue to invest in these premises for the benefit of those many businesses and industrial concerns which are so important to the Moray economy.

As well as supporting business and industry the Council also supports many sports clubs and other leisure activities throughout Moray by letting halls and pitches at nominal rents.
